“Although a native of Massachusetts, Joseph Hooker lived most of the 1850s in the Sonoma County and thereafter considered himself a Californian. His years in the Sonoma Valley demonstrated his energy, his supreme self-confidence, and his organizational skills, but a court-martial in Sonoma earned him the enmity of those who would derail his future career as a Major General in the Civil War.”

“Peter Meyerhof is a general dentist with a practice in Sonoma. Over the last 20 years, he has conducted original historical research using mostly primary sources on early Sonoma history. The subjects he has investigated include the lives of various Native Americans, Californios, and pioneers as well as the events they participated in between the years of the Mission period and the Civil War. His research has taken him to archives and libraries across the country and resulted in many presentations and a growing list of publications.
